



252 Badge award scheme

The aim of the scheme is to provide an incentive to improve an archer's skill when shooting **outdoors**.

Arrows are shot at the specified distance using a 122cm face and Archery GB 9-based, 5 zone scoring.



36 arrows for all bows. Usually 6 per end.

The 36 arrows may be shot alone or as the first 36 of any outdoor round.

A qualifying score has to be achieved twice, not necessarily consecutively.

Distances, with associated badge, are 20yds, 30yds, 40yds, 50yds, 60yds, 80yds and 100yards.

Your average score (when shooting recurve) has to be 7 (252 divided by 36 arrows).

Six sighters are permitted which will not count to the final score.

You can only claim one "252 Badge" per day.

Badges can be attempted in any order.

Only one badge will be awarded even if a qualifying score is shot with several bow types.

The claim should be presented to the Records Officer who will be responsible for verifying the claim, and awarding the appropriate badge as soon as possible after the scores has been achieved.
